November was a unique month, as every month has been, for the MDVA which saw:

- A scaled down Poppy Campaign, which Rick Paci and Bill Guiller, along with their band of volunteers ran. They raised a little over \$20,000 which was about 1/2 of what we raised in 2019.
- A Remembrance Day which was virtual as we were not able to congregate and enjoy
 fellowship with our Veterans and their families.....a Remembrance Day for the history books.
- Gary Bowerman did us proud with a sunrise ceremony to Remembrance Week with the laying
 of 5 wreaths at the cenotaph with a small group of MDVA members and 5 York Regional
 Police in attendance.
- The 2nd Markham Scouts gave us a wonderful montage of scouts "Thanking Veterans" which is on display in the MDVA club room (and attached).
- We received no nominations for the 2021 President, Secretary, Treasurer and Directors so there was no election held.
- Dawne Ramkay is stepping down at the end of December from the Board. Dawne was Membership Director so I have asked Larry Lau to assume this responsibility along with Sergeant-at-Arms. When we are allowed to have General Meetings, I will appoint a Sergeant and bring the name forward for acceptance by the membership.
- The Board made Marjorie Nielsen a Life Member for her ardent support of the MDVA for many, many years.
 Marjorie was thrilled to receive it but sadly passed away last week from cancer. Her presence and support will be greatly missed by all of us.
- The Board made the decision to open the club from Monday to Saturday, 4PM - 8PM. This action was supported by our Bar Stewards who came forward with "volunteering" their time to help us manage the additional expenses of this change. Strict Covid protocols remain in effect, so please help us stay open by following them.

The MDVA has applied for a number of financial grants made available by both the Federal and Provincial Governments and we hope to know by the middle of December if our applications have



been approved. John Craig has done a fantastic job of framing our financial position on the grant applications so keep your fingers and toes crossed.

The Ontario Resiliency Grant application is due on December 9th and that remains our immediate focus. Our ask is for an accessible washroom in the hall, improved air conditioning in the club room and sanitizing equipment and portable air cleaners. A final decision on whether or not our application is accepted will not be until early 2021.

"Thank You" to Janet Morgan who has supplied the club with some lovely poinsettia plants to brighten up the clubroom for the holidays.

While there is light at the end of this pandemic with the approval and early delivery of vaccines, I still see the MDVA remaining closed to General Meetings for the foreseeable future, but your Board will continue to keep you updated via email and newsletters.

Please join me in "Thanking" this year's Board for their hard work and making tough decisions as they manoeuvred the clubs way through the complexities and challenges that the Covid pandemic has presented us with. Normally the board goes on recess from July to September but this year they worked throughout.

As we enter the holidays, I send my best wishes to you and your families for a safe and healthy Christmas and New Year, and let us not forget the many members we have lost this past year and who we will dearly miss.

Please stay safe, follow the guidelines asked of us, and let us look forward to being able to gather again in 2021. **David**

Trivia Corner: Canadian Christmas Fun Facts

Christmas is the time of year when many Canadians get together to enjoy the holiday season with family and friends – well maybe not in 2020!

Like our American neighbours, Christmas in Canada is celebrated with a mish-mash of different traditions' brought about by different geographical regions and cultures.

For example, a German immigrant, Baron Friederick von Riedesel, first introduced Canada to the Christmas tree in 1781 in Sorel, Quebec.

And, while roast beef and goose are still on the menu in many households, today Canadians more often follow the tradition of serving roast turkey on Christmas Day.

Of course, Christmas is also the time of year when Canada's stores are usually packed with shoppers looking for holiday eats, sporting goods, electronic games, toys, and other gifts that remain popular year after year. The difference this year, is that most of us who would normally go out to the Mall to do our shopping, most of us this year are doing our shopping "on-line".

Shop 'til you drop

\$549 million — The value of consumer electronics, such as televisions and audio and video equipment purchased at large retailers in Canada in December, with a 127% spike compared to average monthly sales.

\$435 million — The value of toys, games and hobby supplies, including video games, purchased at large retailers in Canada in December, up a whopping 184% from average monthly sales for this category.

Canadian Christmas - It's time to party

6.7 million litres — The volume of commercial sales of eggnog in Canada in December. Virtually all eggnog sales are in November and December.

\$449 million — The amount of monthly sales of candy, Christmas chocolate and snack foods sales at large retailers in December, the month with the highest sales.

2,381 — The number of farms that grow Christmas trees in Canada. The most Christmas tree farms are found in Ontario, with 647 farms.

55 acres — The average area of land per farm allocated to growing Christmas trees in Quebec. Christmas tree farms in Quebec are, on average, the largest in Canada, followed by Nova Scotia with an average size of 52 acres per farm.

Festively named places in Canada:

For the most festively named place in Canada, **Christmas Island**, Nova Scotia. Then again, there is Gift Lake in Alberta, and **Reindeer Station** in the Northwest Territories, At Christmas, also give a shout out to **Chimney Lake**, British Columbia, **Sled Lake** in Saskatchewan, and the decoratively named **Holly**, **Ontario**.
