Looking back at last year, while it was a topsy turvy one, the MDVA was able to function quite well....

- We received grants from the provincial and federal government and other agencies that helped us to manage financially while we were locked down. A huge shout out of thanks goes to our Treasurer, John Craig, for securing them for us.
- We were also the recipient in December of a donation of \$2,000 from the Connecting GTA association. Rukshan Para, one of our members, was the driving force in securing this for us. Thank you Rukshan.





- Our Poppy Campaign was again successful despite the restrictions that we had to operate under. Rick Paci and Bill Guiler, along with the entire Poppy team brought in approximately \$25,000.00, a slight increase over the 2020 Poppy Campaign. Way to go team.
- We brought back the famous MDVA meat draw and had 2 very successful events thanks to Karen Mooney and Shelley Fazackerley. They even managed to get our very own, and the one and only, Busy Betty to MC both events. Both events raised over \$2,000 not to mention the additional revenue bump we received from the strong bar sales. Way to go ladies!
- Thank you to Michele Chalmers, Carl Amoyette, Mike Johnson and Dave Watson for running the various weekly and special events that our members so enjoy.

- Karen Kearns and her team have done an outstanding job of supporting our members and others in the community. They have provided gift baskets to some of the Long Term Care facilities, they have sent flowers and fruit baskets to our members who have been ill, taking members to hospital or doctor visits and done grocery shopping for supplies. We have also supported members financially when requests have been brought forward, Karen is a gem!
- We purchased 2 air purifiers for the Club and Unionville rooms to clean the air and provide a safer environment for our members.
- We applied for 2 grants to provide upgrades to the building but have yet to hear back on them.

On the downside, we were not able to host many of our usual social events because of lockdowns and capacity restrictions so we lost a lot of revenue from those events and the rental of the hall. More importantly, we also lost a number of our beloved members. Our thoughts and prayers go out to their family and friends and we will always remember them. Our plan is to do a Celebration of Life honoring them once we can safely gather again.

Lastly, thank you to all of the members who come in on a regular basis to support the club and enjoy the fellowship and camaraderie that we all need to help us stay sane during this pandemic.






## Final two Rivalry Series games between Canada, U.S. women cancelled in Alberta

- CALGARY Two hockey games between the Canadian and U.S. women's hockey teams in Alberta have been cancelled
- Canada and the U.S. were scheduled to conclude their Rivalry Series on Jan. 3 in Edmonton during the world junior men's hockey championship and Jan. 6 in Red Deer.
- Both games were called off because several Canadian players and staff were in COVID-19 protocol, Hockey Canada said
- "Unfortunately, we need to do what is right for our athletes from a health perspective and for our team preparation in order to ensure everyone remains healthy and eligible for Beijing."
- The announcement came the same day the U.S. junior men's team forfeited a preliminary-round game at the under-20 championship to Switzerland because two American players tested positive for the COVID-19 virus.
- What was a nine-game series between the Canadian and American women to help both prepare for February's Winter Olympics in Beijing and choose a roster for it was limited to six games.
- Canada won four of the six games played against the U.S., including two in overtime.

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
